**The Apostles' Creed**

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, the Maker of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord: Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; He descended into hell. The third day He arose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Ghost; the holy catholic church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting.  
Amen.

Note—"He descended into hell":  
When learning this historic creed, we might clarify to our children that we do not believe that Jesus literally descended into Hell to suffer more punishment for sin after He declared, "It is finished," and died on the cross. Rather, we understand that while suffering on the cross, our Lord endured the full weight of Hell, "descending into hell", as it were. John Calvin comments, "After explaining what Christ endured in the sight of man, the Creed appropriately adds the invisible and incomprehensible judgment which he endured before God, to teach us that not only was the body of Christ given up as the price of redemption, but that there was a greater and more excellent price—that he bore in his soul the tortures of a condemned and ruined man" (Institutes 2.16.10).
