Note-"He descended into hell":

When learning this historic creed, we might clarify to our children that we do not believe that Jesus literally descended into Hell to suffer more punishment for sin after He declared, "It is finished," and died on the cross. Rather, we understand that while suffering on the cross, our Lord endured the full weight of Hell, "descending into hell", as it were. John Calvin comments, "After explaining what Christ endured in the sight of man, the Creed appropriately adds the invisible and incomprehensible Judament which he endured before God, to teach us that not only was the body of Christ given up as the price of redemption, but that there was a greater and more excellent price-that he bare in his soul the tortures of a condemned and ruined man" (Institutes 2.16.10).

Rather, we understand that while suffering on the cross, our Lord endured the full weight of Hell, "descending into hell", as it were. John Calvin comments. "After explaining what Christ endured in the sight of man, the Creed appropriately adds the invisible and incomprehensible judgment which he endured before God, to teach us that not only was the body of Christ given up as the price of redemption, but that there was a greater and more excellent price-that he bore in his soul the tortures of a condemned and ruined man" (Institutes 2.16.10).
